Who is responsible for the Education of the children?

The U.S. Supreme Court unanimously ruled that ...the Act of 1922, relating to an Oregon case unreasonably interfered with the liberty of the parents and guardians to direct the upbringing and education of children under their control....The child is not the mere creature of the state; those who nurture him and direct his destiny have the right, coupled with the high duty, to recognize and prepare him for additional obligations. This clearly shows that the parents have the ultimate right to train and educate their own children. The recent achievements of parental choice of education for their children show that even the state governments can benefit the school choice because of their budget deficits for public education. Nationwide voucher programs not only helped many parents and their children but helped many State and Federal government to save millions of dollars in an era of huge financial constraints. School choice year book shows that 200,000 students greatly took advantage of twenty publically funded private school programs in the states including the District of Columbia.

In his research, Dr. Patrick F. Fagan found that students most likely to receive A's in school are those who grew up in intact married families and who now worship at least weekly.

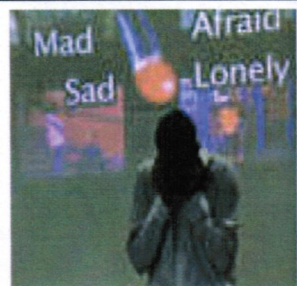
Nation's Report Card

Bullying in Schools

It is reported that every seven minutes a child is being bullied in school. It is not true with our school. Bullying is a crime. 30% of U.S. students in grade six through ten are involved in moderate or frequent bullying according to a national survey. Recent statistics show that one out of four kids is bullied. One out of every four kids will be abused by another youth. Seventy-seven percent are bullied mentally, verbally or physically and forty-four percent said they felt severe reactions. Bullying caused children missing schools. 282,000 students are physically attacked in secondary schools. School Violence Research found the following reasons for bullying: (1) Children witnessed domestic violence at home (2) They witnessed violence in the neighborhood (3) bullying happened to make friendship or to get out of friendship. (4) Some children were influenced by their peers to get involved. (5) When some children are socially isolated, their retaliation will result in bullying. School bullying was very rare when school prayers and Bible reading and the teaching of the Ten Commandments were prevalent in schools. When teachings of moral values are removed from young people, the sinful nature of humanity will turn the society into anarchy. Bullying, crime, violence, and other forms of wickedness will increase in the society resulting in an increased prison population. The Bible says that the earth was full of violence during the time of Noah. Jesus said, "As in the days of Noah, so shall also be the days of the son of man." (Luke.17:26)
